






Call for Papers

'Translation, education and pragmatics' (TEP) postgraduate symposium

The symposium intends to encourage postgraduate collaboration and the exchange of innovative and creative ideas in the field of translation studies among neighbouring universities in Southern Europe. Our long-term aim is to open up to other universities that offer postgraduate degree programmes in translation studies.

The idea of working collaboratively on this educational project started during a series of joint talks given at shared postgraduate sessions. Our intention was to balance the isolation following the second wave of the pandemic (Autumn 2020). On that occasion, the organizers soon realized that there was more to this initial collaboration and thought of expanding it by organizing a postgraduate symposium on translation, education and pragmatics, with a view to highlighting the interconnection and interdisciplinary potential of these disciplines. The fields of education and pragmatics have important insights to offer to translation studies and translation

studies can vigorously return the favour by sharing a new platform with both education and pragmatics in a fruitful debate on common issues and topics. The postgraduate symposium intends to explore the extent to which the three disciplines can engage in a fruitful dialogue to their mutual benefit.
